Since 1965, Title I has provided supplemental services, mainly in the areas of reading, mathematics, and language arts, to students experiencing difficulties in those academic areas. It is the largest and one of the most successful federal elementary and secondary education programs in the history of the United States. Millions of children nationwide have enjoyed improved academic performance as a result of services provided by Title I programs.</p>
